SOUTH WALES METRO - TAFF'S WELL STATION WORK

We are continuing to deliver our work in Taff's Well for the delivery of our Metro service and will continue to provide you with updates on our progress and upcoming work at both the depot, control centre and Station. We would like to thank you for your continued patience as we carry out these transformational works in Taff's Well and want to provide you with information on the upcoming work at Taff's Well Station to begin the installation of the new Access for All bridge.

Installing a new Access For All footbridge at Taff's Well Station


We will shortly begin preparatory work to install a new Access For All bridge at Taff's Well station with lift and step access to each platform. This new bridge will greatly improve the accessibility at the station, as well as level boarding improvements from platform to train with the introduction of the new tram-trains.


We need to install the foundations for the bridge using heavy machinery which, when installing the piles into the ground, makes a lot of noise. We plan to complete this work during daytime hours only and will do our best to reduce the impact it will have on people living near the station.

Upcoming work dates

We endeavour to complete the majority of work to create the foundations for the new Access for All bridge during daytime shifts only, from 08:00 to 18:00.

We will begin the enabling works in preparation to create the foundations for the bridge during midweek daytime shifts from Monday 10 April to Friday 14 April. These works will include erecting temporary hoarding around the work site, drainage works in the station car park and the installation of a piling platform on the car park side of the station.

From Monday 17 to Friday 21 April, we will be carrying out piling works to create the foundations for the bridge on the 'down' platform, located nearest to the station car park.

There are several different methods of piling, of which we will be utilising bored piles, which will be drilled into the ground. Whilst this work can be particularly noisy, utilising this method of piling is less disruptive than other methods, such as sheet piling where the piles are vibrated or driven into the ground. Piling can be a noisy job as it involves heavy machinery, with noise levels depending on the distance from the piling location and local topography however, all piling works at the station will be carried out during daytime shifts to minimise disruption. We'll make every effort to minimise unnecessary

noise and complete each pile as quickly as possible.





Following this, the railway line will be closed during weekdays over three weeks on the following dates;

- Tuesday 25 to Friday 28 April
- Monday O1 to Friday O5 May
- Monday 08 to Friday 12 May.

The team will work during the daytime only throughout this period, during which time they will be carrying out ducting work on the down platform, nearest to the station car park, to re-route all platform services over the new bridge and to provide power for the lifts.

From Tuesday 25 April to Friday 28 April, we will be carrying out piling works to create the foundations for the bridge on the 'Up' platform, the side closet to properties. To allow us to move the piling equipment from the compound site in the station car park onto the tracks, we will be installing a temporary Cordek bridge that will span across the two tracks. We will also be carrying out platform fencing works on both platforms and ducting work on the down platform during this time.

From Monday 15 to Friday 19 May, we will continue work to create the foundation on the down platform, on the car park side of the station. The railway line will be open during this time. The foundation work will continue during midweek day shifts from Monday 22 to Friday 26 May, and from Monday 29 May to Friday 02 June. We will also carry out platform ducting works on the 'up' platform during this time.










Station and station footbridge access



To allow us to install the new footbridge, there will be some changes to car parking at Taff's Well station. From **Monday 17th April** the current station car park, shown in blue above, will be closed whilst we construct the new bridge and upgrade parking facilities. During this period, alternative parking (80 spaces) will be available in the station overflow facility, shown in yellow, situated next to the Amey Rail warehouse opposite the station. Please note that the area highlighted in red is restricted to staff parking only.

The existing station footbridge will remain in place and will be open to use whilst the new bridge is constructed.
